### Architecture Timeline of Important Historic Periods

It is the secular architecture of late medieval/Venice. An exceptional example is the Doge's Palace, built in its present form between 1340 and about 1500. The top-heavy appearance of the palace, with an almost solid wall resting on two storeys of delicate open arches, is caused by the need to accommodate a great council hall on the top floor.
